The Wolverhampton Outreach Service	As part of the SEND Early Identification and Support Services (EISS) in Wolverhampton, the Wolverhampton Outreach Service is a team of specialist teachers and HLTAs who are based in four of the City's special schools (Broadmeadow, Penn Fields, Penn Hall and Tettenhall Wood). The purpose of this service is to enable mainstream schools to adapt their practices in order to facilitate the inclusion of children with SEND. This includes training for school staff and practitioner led support. Staff on the team have experience in all four areas of need, including autism and social emotional and mental health needs.  Outreach offer regular workshops for parents/carers which cover a variety of topics.
